



The President's FY14 Budget Request

Proposed Investments in STEM:

- \$150 million for grants to STEM Innovation Networks
- \$5 million will be set aside from this program for a STEM Virtual Learning Network
- \$35 million to pilot the STEM Master Teacher Corps
- \$80 million to recruit and train effective STEM teachers

Proposed investments in Career and Technical Education:


- \$1.1 billion to support the reauthorization of the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program
- \$42 million for CTE-focused dual-enrollment
- \$1.1 billion to support the reauthorization of the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program
- \$42 million for CTE-focused dual-enrollment programs

Programs that primarily support STEM:

- Math Science Partnerships
- Teacher Incentive Fund - STEM
- Minority Science and Engineering Improvement Program
- Hispanic Serving Institutions STEM and Articulation Programs
- Upward Bound Math and Science Program
