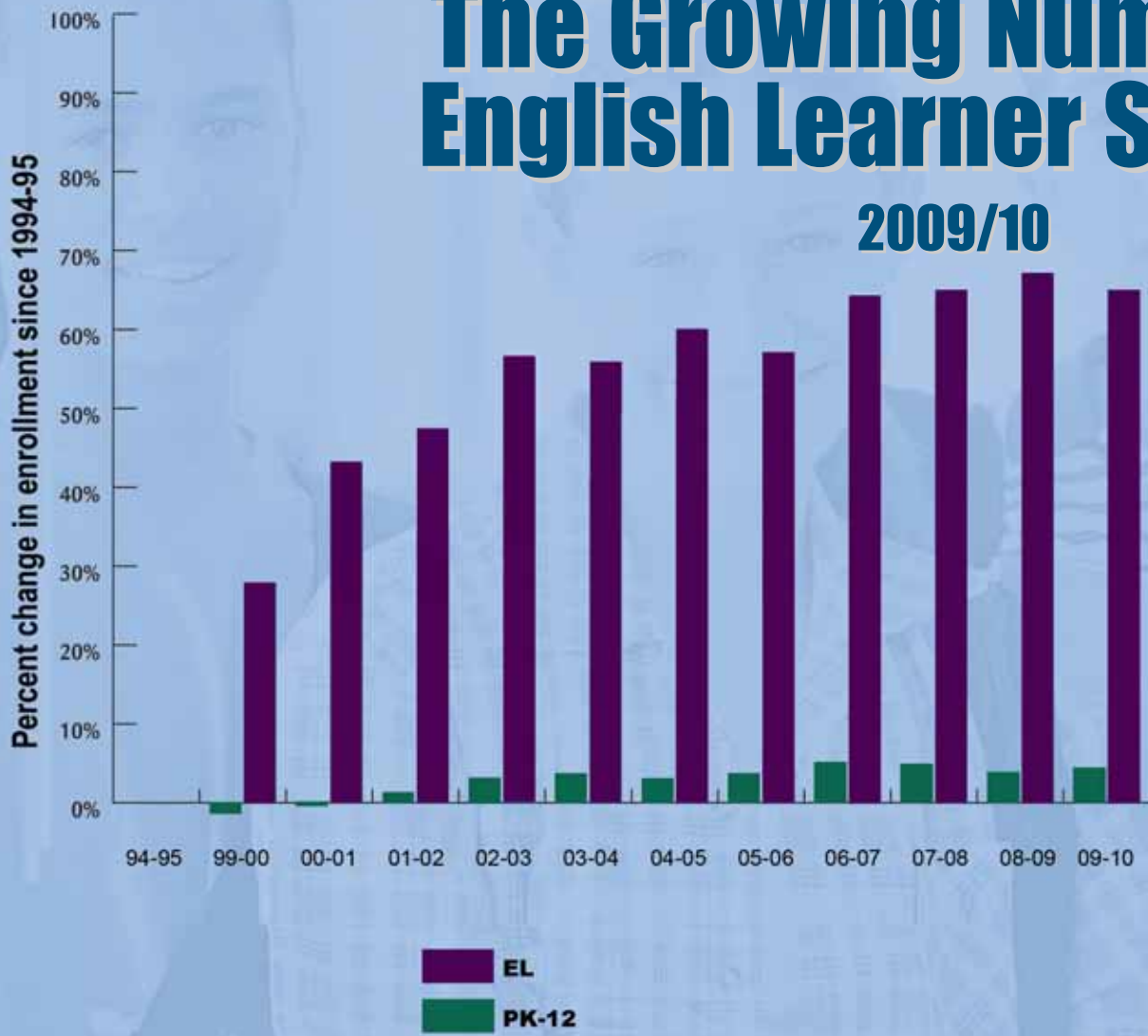

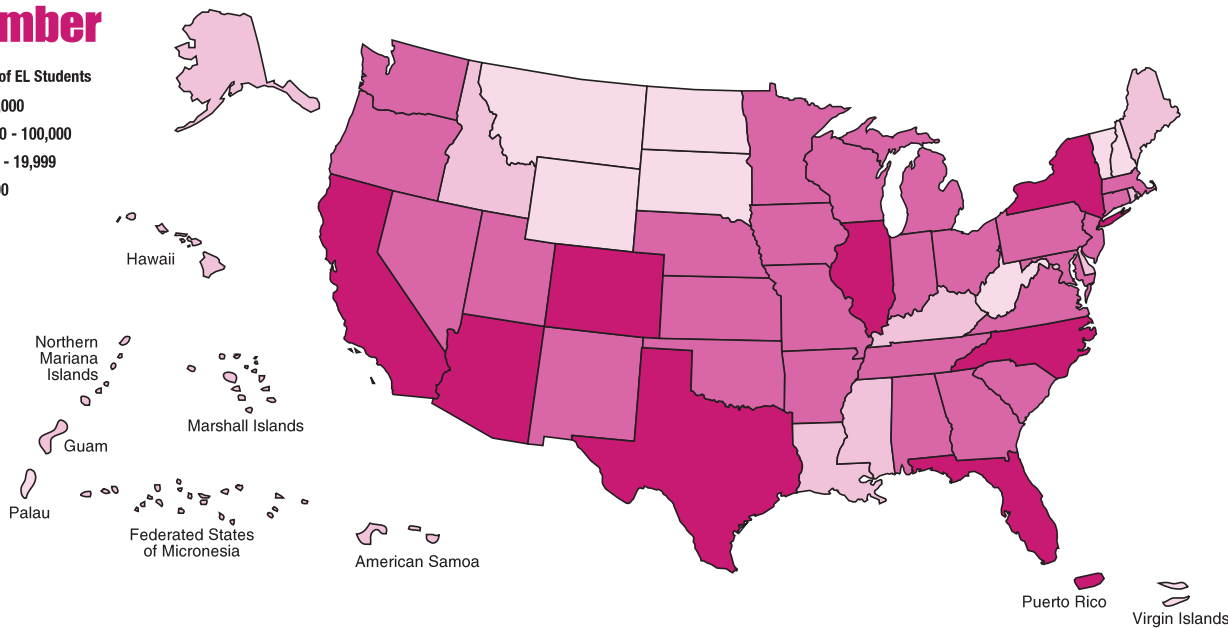

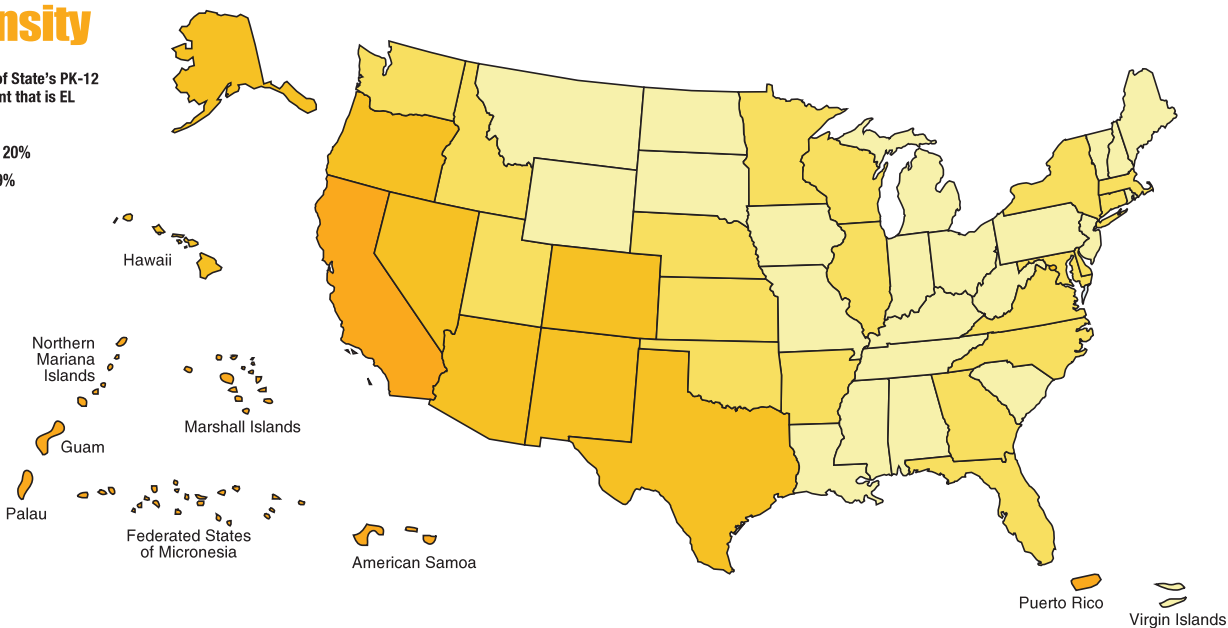

## Change

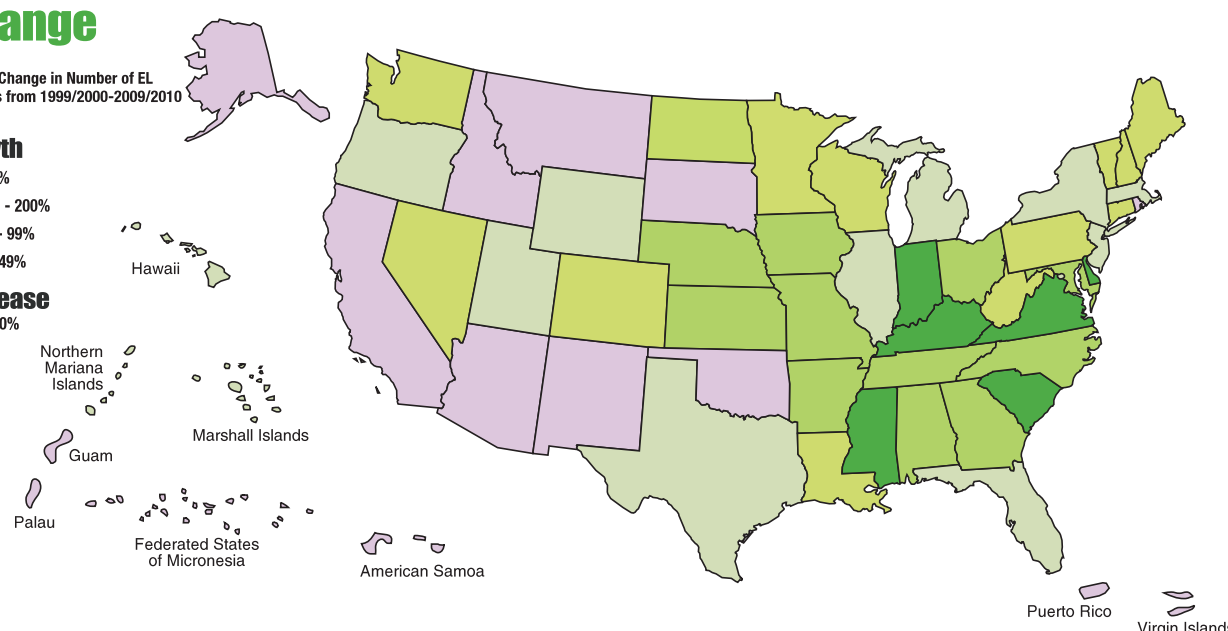
Percent Change in Number of EL Students from 1999/2000-2009/2010
