DID YOU KNOW?

- The Fairbanks North Star Borough School District (FNSBSD) has 35 schools serving 14,300 students, including 21 elementary schools, 3 middle schools, and 2 high schools.
- Schools range in size from a small rural elementary school of fewer than 100 students to comprehensive high schools with 1200 students.
- In general, the average student in Fairbanks School District outperforms the average student in the state or the nation on academic assessments (Alaska Standards Based Assessments, Scholastic Aptitude Test, American College Test, TerraNova, etc).
