- The Browning School District serves 1932 student and is comprised of Browning High School, Browning Middle School, Napi Elementary, Browning Elementary, Vina Chattin Elementary, and KW Bergan Elementary. Additionally, the school district has three rural schools. Babb Elementary is found in Babb, Montana, which is located 30 miles north of Browning. Glendale and Big Sky Elementaries serve two Hutterite colonies near Browning.
- The district is home to the Blackfoot Indian Tribe and the district actively promotes the Native language through a variety of programs for the students, including “Blackfeet Word of the Day.”
