DID YOU KNOW?

- Kansas serves a total of 474,489 students in 327 school districts.
- Nearly two-thirds of the districts in Kansas (65%) are classified as “rural.”
- More than one-quarter (29.1%) of students in the state are served in rural districts; 7.2% of EL students are served in rural districts.
- School districts in Kansas offer bilingual programs, English-based programs, and Newcomer programs to meet the educational needs of their EL students.
