DID YOU KNOW?

- North Dakota's 225 school districts serve 93,055 students.
- The vast majority (83.2%) of school districts in North Dakota are rural; yet most of the students are in the four urban school districts.
- Dakota's overall enrollment is decreasing, while the multicultural student enrollment is increasing.
- North Dakota is one of six states in which Spanish is not the most frequently reported language for ELs.
- The majority of North Dakota's ELs speak Native American languages, with Ojibwa the most frequently reported.
