

NUMBER OF ELs, BY STATE, INCLUDING D.C.: SY 2016-17





PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL STUDENT POPULATION THAT ARE ELS, BY STATE: SY 2015-16*











NUMBER OF STATES, INCLUDING D.C., WITH APPROVED SEAL OF BILITERACY: 2011-2019





- 37 states, including D.C., have approved/enacted the Seal of Biliteracy
- Legislators in VT are still considering to vote on Seal of Biliteracy bills
- 12 states (ID, WY, NE, OK, AL, KY, WV, MS, PA, AK, VT and NH) have initiated the Seal of Biliteracy
- 2 states (MT and ND) have not yet initiated the Seal of Biliteracy
